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#### **MATERIALS:**

2mm crochet hook, white, brown, bege, gray, any extra colorful yarn for the flowers, sewing needle, stuffing material, pins.



Lady Cow is a design toy created by **TheNomadKnot** especially for the **"Farm Friends" collection**.

This toy was crocheted with 100% acrylic yarn. Using a 2mm crochet hook and light yarn (around 50g), the finished size must be around 11cm. The stuffing material used in this toy is hypoallergenic polyester.

This pattern is for personal use. Sharing information from this pattern is prohibited. You may sell items made from this pattern, provided credit to The Nomad Knot as the designer. For this pattern we will work the animal starting from the legs and finishing at the head. Let's begin!

### LEGS


With brown yarn start;

1 row	6sc in magic ring
2 row	6inc. Total: 12sts
3 row	12Bpsc (see image 02)

Change to white yarn

4 to 6 row 12SC

- Finish the first leg and make the second one. For the second leg, I changed to white yarn at row 5, to make the stripes uneven (image 03).
- Don't cut the yarn of the second leg;
- Chain one (image 04).

Connect the two legs (introducing the loop inside one stitch of the first finished leg) and start the row 7 (see image 5).

**NOTE:** for row 7 you should make 1SC in the chain, 12SC around the leg, again 1SC in the other side of the chain, 12SC. Having a total of 26 stitches (image 06).

## BODY

Continue working with white yarn;

7 row 26sc 8 row 1sc, (5sc, 1inc) repeat 4 times, 1sc. Total 30sts 9 To 13 row 30sc



(Image 08)

<u>Tip:</u> use a colorful yarn as a marker in the last stitch of every row. This will help you to keep track of your work and avoid getting lost (image 09).


- 14 row (3sc, 1desc) repeat 6 times. Total: 24sts
- **15 row** (2sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. *Total: 18sts*
- 16 row (1sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. *Total 12sts*
- Stop here for stuffing the body before continuing to row 17.



**NOTE:** Next row, you are going to work in BLSL (see image 14). This means that you will create an inside row that will become the beginning of the neck. At row 18, you will work in the remaining front loop of the row 16 (see image 13):

18 row2inc,3sc, 2inc, 1sc, 2inc, 3sc, 2inc, 1scTotal: 20sts19 row3inc, 5sc, 3inc, 3sc, 3inc, 5sc, 3inc, 3scTotal: 32sts20 row3inc, 8sc, 3inc, 6sc, 3inc, 8sc, 3inc, 6scTotal: 44sts



• Stop here for finishing stuffing your toy

 2dec, 1sc, 2dec, 1sc, 2dec, 1sc, 2dec, 1sc

 *Total: 12sts* 6dec

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Hide the remaining yarn inside the toy

#### **ARMS**:


Start with brown yarn,

1 row5sc in a magic ring2 row5inc. Total 10sts

• Change to white yarn

**3 to 7 row** 10sc **8 row** 5dec

- Cut the yarn, fasten off and make another one.
- For the second arm I started with the brown yarn and changed to white at row 5. You can do the same or play with your imagination.
- Do not stuff the arms.



#### EARS

Start with white yarn,

1 row	3sc in a magic ring
2 row	3inc <i>Total 6sts</i>
3 row	(2sc, 1inc) repeat 2 times <i>Total: 8sts</i>
4 row	(3sc, 1inc) repeat 2 times <i>Total:10sts</i>
5 to 9 row	10sc

- Cut the yarn, fasten off and make another one
- For the second ear, I started with white yarn and changed to brown at row 6.



# NOSE

With beige color yarn chain 9.

**NOTE:** Here we are going to work in circles. At the end of the chain 8, we are going to continue the row by turning clockwise the work. (see image 29)

1 row jump first st (7sc, 1inc) repeat 2 times Total 18sts

*Here when you turn your work, the first st is the last one of the first row, where you just made the increase. From there you count 7 making sc in each of them, and an increase in the last one* 

 2 row
 (1inc, 6sc, 1inc, 1sc) repeat 2 times Total 22sts

 3 to 5 row
 22sc

Cut the yarn and fasten off.

#### HORNS

With yarn grey start,

1 row5sc in magic ring2 row2sc, 1inc, 2sc Total: 6sts3 to 4 row6sc

• Cut the yarn, fasten off and make another one.

#### **DOTS AND FLOWERS**

For the bigger dot, start with brown yarn:

- **1 row** 6sc in magic ring
- **2 row** 6inc
- **3 row** (1sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times
- Cut the yarn and fasten off.

#### For the smaller dot and the flowers

**1 row** 6sc in magic ring

- Make one sl at first stitch, cut the yarn and fasten off
- Make 3 with colorful yarn and 1 with brown yarn

#### ASSEMBLY



- 1. Use pins to fasten the body parts of the toy in a way that looks symmetrical to you.
- 2. Sew the arms at the row 16 of the toy
- 3. Sew the ears starting at row 24 and finishing at row 27.
- 4. Sew the nose starting from row 22.
- 5. Sew the horns on top of the head at row 30.
- 6. Sew the flowers in between the horn and the ears.



### EYES

1. Use pins to help you to find the perfect spot for the eyes.


2. Place them at row 28 with 4 stitches in between them.

How I embroider the eyes.



For most of my projects I prefer to embroider the eyes then the plastic safety ones.

First, I start making horizontal lines respecting some imaginary contour of the eyes. Then, I make vertical lines to finish filling empty gaps. I finalize outlining the shape I just made. And that's it!
