MATERIALS:

2mm crochet hook, pink, red, black and yellow yarn, sewing needle, stuffing material, scissors, pins.



Magician Pig is a design toy created by **TheNomadKnot** especially for the “**Farm Friends**” collection.

This toy was crocheted with 100% acrylic yarn.

Using a 2mm crochet hook and light yarn (around 50g), the finished size must be around 11cm.

The stuffing material used in this toy is hypoallergenic polyester.

This pattern is for personal use. Sharing information from this pattern is prohibited. You may sell items made from this pattern, provided credit to The Nomad Knot as the designer.

For this pattern we will work the animal starting from the legs and finishing at the head. Let's begin!

LEGS

With pink yarn, start:

- | | |
|-------|--------------------------|
| 1 row | 6sc in a magic ring |
| 2 row | 6inc <i>Total: 12sts</i> |
| 3 row | 12bpsc (see image 02) |
| 4 row | 12sc |
| 5 row | 12sc |

- Cut the yarn, fasten off the first leg and make the second one following the same steps.
- Don't cut the yarn off the second leg;
- Chain 2 (image 04).

Tip: at the end of every row, count how many stitches you have in total. This will help you to never leave a stitch behind.

Connect the two legs (introducing the loop inside one stitch of the first finished leg) and start the row 6 (see image 5).

NOTE: for row 6 you should make 12sc, 1sc in each of the two chains, 12sc, again 1sc in each of the two chains. Having a total of 28 stitches making a circle around the two legs (See image 06).

BODY

- 6 to 10 row 28sc
- 11 row (12sc, 1dec) repeat 2 times. *Total: 26sts*
- 12 row (11sc, 1dec) repeat 2 times. *Total : 24sts*

Tip: use a colorful yarn as a marker in the last stitch of every row. This will help you to keep track of your work and avoid getting lost (image 08).

13 row (10sc, 1dec) repeat 2 times. *Total : 22sts*
14 row (9sc, 1dec) repeat 2 times. *Total : 20sts*
15 row (8sc, 1dec) repeat 2 times. *Total : 18sts*

- Stop here for stuffing the body before continuing to row 16.

NOTE: Next row you are going to work in BLSL (see image 12). This means that you will create an inside row that will become the beginning of the neck. At row 17, you will work in the remaining front loop of the row 15 (see image 13).

HEAD

16 row	18BLOsl (see image 12 and 13)
17 row	FLO(2sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 24sts</i>
18 row	(3sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 30sts</i>
19 row	(4sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 36sts</i>
20 row	(5sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 42sts</i>
21 row	(6sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 48sts</i>
22 row	(7sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 54sts</i>
23 to 27 row	54sc
28 row	(7sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 48sts</i>
29 row	(6sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 42sts</i>
30 row	(5sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 36sts</i>
31 row	(4sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 30sts</i>
32 row	(3sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 24sts</i>
33 row	(2sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 18sts</i>

- It's time to finish stuffing your piggy!

NOTE: If you wish to use the safety eyes, stop here and place them on row 25 with 10 stitches between them.

32 row (1sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times.

Total: 12sts

33 row 6dec. *Total: 6sts*

- Cut the yarn, tighten all the stitches and hide the remaining yarn inside the head.

ARMS

1 row 4sc in a Magic ring

2 row 4inc *Total: 8sts*

3 row 8bpsc (see image 02)

4 to 9 row 8sc

- Cut the yarn, fasten off and make another one.
- Do not stuff the arms.

EARS

1 row	6sc in a magic ring
2 row	(2sc, 1inc) repeat 2 times <i>Total: 8sts</i>
3 row	(3sc, 1inc) repeat 2 times. <i>Total: 10sts</i>
4 row	(4sc, 1inc) repeat 2 times. <i>Total: 12sts</i>
5 row	(1sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 18sts</i>
6 row	(2sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 24sts</i>
7 row	24sc
8 row	(2sc, 1dec) repeat 6 times <i>Total: 18sts</i>

- Cut the yarn, fasten off and make another one.
- Don't stuff the ear. Make them flat with your fingers.

NOSE

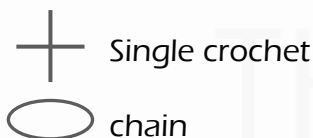
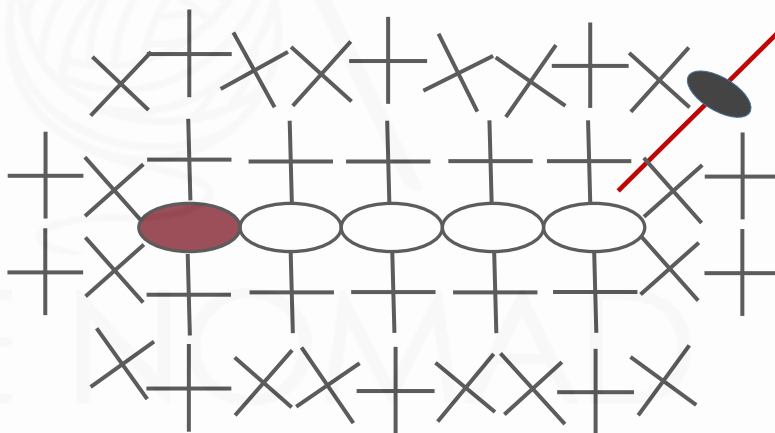
- 1 row Chain 5
 2 row 4sc, 3inc; rotate the chain and keep working on the opposite side (3sc, 2inc). *Total: 14 sts*

- Keep working in circle

- 3 row (1inc, 1inc, 1sc, 1inc, 1inc, 2sc) repeat 2 times *Total: 22sts*

- Connect with SI

- 4 row 22bpsc
 5 row 22sc

Tip: remember that 3INC means 1sc plus 3inc, making a total of 4sc inside the stitch you are working on! Same way that 2INC means 1sc plus 2inc, a total of 3sc, and 1inc means 1sc plus 1inc!

HAT

With black yarn start,

| 1 row | 6sc in a magic ring |
| 2 row | 6inc. <i>Total: 12sts</i> |
| 3 row | (1sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 18sts</i> |
| 4 row | (2sc, 1inc) repeat 6 times. <i>Total: 24sts</i> |
| 5 row | 24blosc |
| 6 to 11 row | 24sc |

- Change to yellow yarn

| 12 row | 24blsl |
| 13 row | 24blsc |

- Change back to black yarn

| 14 row | 24blsl |
| 15 row | BL(1sc, 1inc) repeat 12 times. <i>Total: 36sts</i> |
| 16 row | (2sc, 1inc) repeat 12 times. <i>Total: 48sts</i> |

- Cut the yarn and fasten off.

TIE

1 row	Chain 5
2 row	5sc
3 row	2sc, 1dec, 1sc <i>Total: 4sts</i>
4 row	1sc, 1dec, 1sc <i>Total: 3sts</i>
5 row	1sc, 1dec total: 2sts
6 row	1dec
7 row	1inc <i>Total: 2sts</i>
8 row	1sc, 1inc <i>Total: 3sts</i>
9 row	1sc, 1inc, 1sc <i>Total: 4sts</i>
10 row	2sc, 1inc, 1sc <i>Total: 5sts</i>

- Make 24SL all around the tie (image37).
- Cut the yarn and fasten off
- Cut 30cm of red yarn and roll around the middle part of your tie turning it to a shape of a bow (image 38 and 39) and fasten off.
- Leave the remaining yarn to sew the tie in the middle of the body

ASSEMBLY

1. Use pins to fasten the body parts of the toy in a way that looks symmetrical to you.
2. Sew the arms at row 15 of the toy
3. Sew the ears starting at row 22 and finishing 2 rows before the end.
4. Sew the nose starting from row 20. Use the remaining yarn to sew a pig nose detail
5. To sew the hat over the head of the pig is optional to you!

EYES

1. Use pins to help you to find the perfect spot for the eyes.
2. Place them at row 26 with 8 stitches in between them.

How I embroider the eyes.



For most of my projects I prefer to embroider the eyes then the plastic safety ones.

First, I start making horizontal lines respecting some imaginary contour of the eyes. Then, I make vertical lines to finish filling empty gaps. I finalize outlining the shape I just made. And that's it!

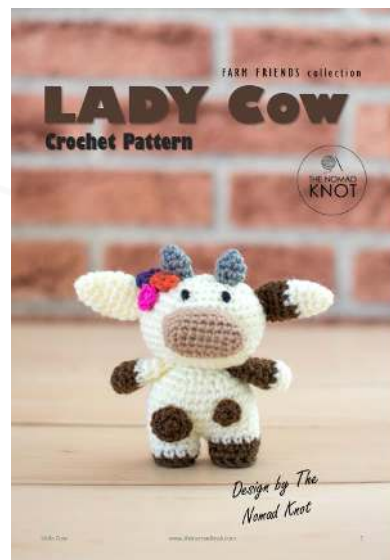
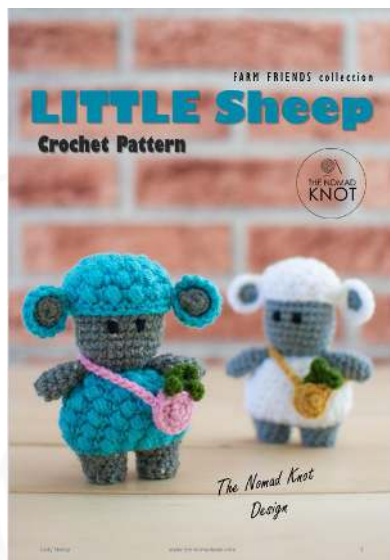
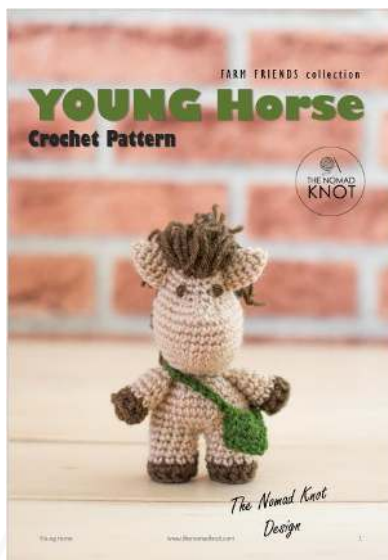
